PART B: PERFORMANCE INFORMATION AND OVERSIGHT REPORT

Performance Information

In terms of section 90(3) of the Correctional Services Act 111 of 1998 the Inspecting Judge (IJ) must report on each inspection to the Minister and the Parliamentary Portfolio Committee on Justice and Correctional Services.

The IJ and the Ministry have agreed that reports on inspections will be submitted as quarterly reports. When necessary reports on specific inspections will be submitted. The submission of this quarterly report to the Minister, Deputy Minister and Portfolio Committee is in compliance of the aforementioned section.

As a matter of courtesy and for the purposes of effective remedial action and cooperation, the report is also submitted to the National Commissioner of Correctional Services.

Inspections

Twenty four inspections including the two from the IJ, were conducted during the third quarter (1 October – 31 December 2017) as per the national inspection plan of the Judicial Inspectorate for Correctional Services (JICS). JICS is currently in the process of engaging the Department of Correctional Services (DCS) regarding its findings and recommendations.

The Inspecting Judge conducted oversight visits at the Potchefstroom Remand Detention Facility and the Mangaung Correctional Centre during this quarter. Reports on the visits are attached as **Annexure A**.



PART F: UPDATE BY THE INSPECTING JUDGE: STAFF; OFFICE SPACE AND ACCOMMODATION

Staff

At the assumption of office by the IJ on 1 April 2016 JICS was understaffed. In view of its important task, it still is. However, significant progress has been made.

The <u>organogram</u> (**Annexure B**) shows the staff position of JICS in April 2016:

In his May 2016 speech the Minister indicated that 42 new positions had been allocated to JICS. This was much welcomed. Due to differences of interpretation amongst JICS, DCS and Treasury, it was not easy to have these positions formalised and filled.

Most of the JICS positions have now been filled, especially because of the energetic efforts of Mr Vick Misser (who took office as CEO in September 2017) and Mr Eddie Brewis (who joined JICS late in 2016 to head Human Resources).

Office Space and Accommodation

The head office of JICS used to be on the ninth floor of the Standard Bank building, Thibault Square, Cape Town. The Northern Management Region (NMR) has been housed in Centurion, Gauteng.

The Centurion office space is inadequate for the NMR.

For various reasons the head office is in the process of being relocated to Tshwane and Cape Town will house the Western Cape Management Region. For a while the IJ, CEO and several head office staff members have used the Centurion accommodation of the NMR. As was observed first-hand by the Minister and staff of the Ministry, this situation was completely untenable.

Since the IJ took office in April 2016, JICS has repeatedly attempted to secure office space for the head office and NMR, by appealing to and working with DCS and the Department of Public works. The process has been slow and frustrating and it is uncertain if any progress has been made.

The IJ, CEO and others are in the process of moving to the 33rd floor of the Poyntons Building in Pretoria. JICS truly appreciates the fact that DCS has made space available on a temporary basis.

On the positive side, the offices are a decent size and the view of Northern- and Southern Pretoria is scenic, however much renovation is needed. The route from the parking basement is long and arduous. No elevator goes to the 33rd floor and only one elevator is partially functional. The journey from the IJ's (currently completely empty) office to the street takes at least 20 minutes, often much longer.

It might also not be good for the perceived independence – or lack thereof – of JICS to be seen to be housed by DCS.

ANNEXURE A

Oversight Visit by the Inspecting Judge of the Potchefstroom Remand Detention Centre: 6 October 2017

Overview of the Centre

Accommodation and overcrowding

Approved accommodation for the facility is 867 bed spaces. However at the time of the visit the centre had lock-up of 1736 which indicates that the centre is 100.11% overcrowded. Overcrowding is the conspicuous problem experienced by correctional centres across South Africa. For example, a visit to a male cell (Cell 2) meant to accommodate 36 inmates had 65 detainees. Some of these have been to court on many occasions where a hearing did not take place and therefore bail could not be considered. Another cell (Cell 4) meant to accommodate 36 inmates, housed 43 remand detainees.

The centre is the only one accommodating female detainees in the North West Province. The bed space for the female unit is 65, however lock-up was 108, indicating overcrowding of 166.15% in that section. The female section's roof is leaking. The JICS inspection report form that was completed before the visit by the Inspecting Judge, indicates that there was one infant at the centre.

Water issues

It was reported that water flow pressure is very low. The Municipality has promised to pump water directly to the centre, but this has not taken place. The inmates use buckets to flush the toilets and cold water to take their baths. A water shortage problem was also reported when the Inspecting Judge visited the Thohoyandou Correction Centre in February 2017.

Healthcare

The Klerksdorp Management Area has two correctional centres, two satellite correctional centres, and four community corrections offices. Only one doctor is assigned to provide healthcare services to the two correctional centres and the satellites.

The centre has 34 mentally ill state patients. There are no psychologists and psychiatrists based at the centre to assist in assessing the mentally ill inmates. However, according to the JICS

inspections form used to record conditions and treatment of inmates at the centre that was completed before the visit, there is a psychologist who visits the centre on a weekly basis to attend to mental health cases.

Assault by officials on inmates

Assault by either official on inmate or inmate on official is common in South African prisons. When the Inspecting Judge visited the Potchefstroom centre there were 14 reported cases of officials on inmates assaults. Of these, five were not reported to the SAPS because apparently the affected inmates do not want to open cases. In all of these cases there were ongoing internal investigations. It is not clear from the inspections report as to what caused the assaults.

Structural maintenance issues

It was reported that the centre was renovated in 2006. At the time of the visit roof leaks, burst water pipes and peeling paint were some of the structural maintenance issues that were reported. The HCC reported that a Repair and Renovation Project (RRP) was in the planning phase and the aim was to commence with it, before the beginning of the new financial year.

CCTV

As it is the case in some of the centres that the Inspecting Judge visited for example, the Oudtshoorn Female Correctional Centre – the "state of the art" integrated CCTV system at the centre last operated in 2015 as a result of the service provider's contract that expired.

Basic appliance repair issues

Inmates do their laundry by hand. In 2014 and 2015 the centre reported to the Department of Public Works (DPW) that the three washing machines and one tumble dryer were out of order. The machines were still not working when the Inspecting Judge visited the centre.

Gangsters

The centre keeps mostly young offenders who belong to various gangs, for example, the Stoute Van Kaks (SVKs), Money Lovers, Crazy Dogs, Enemies, and many others. The Judge visited Cell 4 where he spoke to the inmates and asked about their security and protection at the centre. The Judge asked whether they belong to gangs. The offenders indicated that they belonged to various gangs and lived peacefully in the cell. Some of them were adamant that the state does not have a case against them and that they will be out soon.

Inmate's heritage event at the centre's hall and an address by the Inspecting Judge (IJ)

After the walkabout of the centre, the IJ was invited by the Area Commissioner and the HCC to briefly attend a cultural event organized and attended by both female and male offenders at the centre. The offenders were separated from each other according to their gender. Different groups of male and female offenders sang and danced, and the other group performed a short drama for the audience.

Before the offenders performed and the IJ's address, a "religious" motivational speaker, who calls himself a "Mighty Man of Valour" spoke briefly. He said that he is the "Original Motivational, moral regeneration and soul conviction Speaker." The speaker spoke on many issues. However, it was interesting that he challenged his colleagues in the industry. He also seemed not to comprehend the importance of the law and the Constitution. He said, for example, that lawyers lie in court and that the Constitution is not above God.

The IJ addressed the audience. He made it clear that his mandate is to ensure that inmates' human rights are protected. The IJ indicated to the inmates that they all have inherent dignity as human beings and that this human right is enshrined in the Constitution.

Visit by the Inspecting Judge at the Klerksdorp Museum to View Artworks by Inmates

On 5 October, before the correctional centre visit, the Inspecting Judge paid the Klerksdorp Museum a visit to view the artworks by the inmates. The Klerksdorp Museum is a former prison which was built in 1891. The prison was converted into a museum in 1973. On 21 June 2016, Deputy Minister Thabang Makwetla launched the inmate's art gallery. The gallery showcases impressive art by the inmates. The curators donated two artworks by former inmates.

Oversight Visit by the Inspecting Judge of the Mangaung Correctional Centre: 11 December 2017

Overview of the Centre

Accommodation and overcrowding

The centre has approved accommodation of 2928 for only male maximum sentenced inmates. There are 6 units, each accommodating 488 inmates. Unit cells are made up of two men and four men cells. The inspection form for the Inspecting Judge's visit indicated that the centre was full to its approved capacity. There is no overcrowding at the centre.

Healthcare

Unlike in many centres in the country that are run by the Department on its own, the centre seems to be well staffed with health professionals. It has two doctors, 20 nurses, two psychologists, and two pharmacists who are based full time at the centre. The centre has a 54 beds medical facility, which include an antiretroviral centre providing Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) antiretroviral treatment (ART) to inmates. There are 731 inmates receiving ART treatment. Nurses evaluate each newly admitted inmate within 24 hours.

Nutrition

Inmates are served three meals a day as per section 8 of the Act. They also receive snacks in between meals.

Violence

Assault by officials on inmates

No assaults by officials on inmates or by inmates on officials or by inmates on inmates were reported when the Inspecting Judge visited the centre in early December. However, in October 2017 the ICCV and VCCO reported that there was an incident of assault by inmate on official at the centre.

There is speculation that violence at the centre is predominantly due to gang related activities, however the JICS ICCVs and VCCO are unable to confirm this because no inmates have disclosed

reasons for the violence. Some inmates complain about gangsterism, however no inmates have gone on record about it.

Gangsterism

Gangsterism is one of the challenges faced by correctional centres across South Africa. The operating gangs at the centre are the 26s, 28s, RAFs and the Big 5s. The 26s and the 28s are the most dominant, whereas the Big 5s make up 2% of the gangs. 40% of the inmates are not affiliated to gangs.

Lockdowns

The centre was on lockdown 60 times between January and October 2017. The reason provided for lockdowns is that there were incidents of violence involving stabbings of inmate on inmate and inmates on officials.

Inmates Complaints

According to ICCV reports, information from the director of the centre, Mr Monyante, and in consultation with inmate Mr Seuntjie Tsheole, inmates' complaints are about conditions, reclassification, transfer to the centre closer to their homes and family, assistance by the South African Police Services (SAPS) and participation of segregated inmates in rehabilitation programmes.

Conditions

The centre is not overcrowded and it is starkly different from other centres in terms of cleanliness. There are four men cells and two men cells. For example, inmate Mr Tsheole complained about the soap provided to inmates to bath and to clean their rooms with, as well as about the amount of floor polish provided to them.

It can be reported that the soap provided to inmates to shower is decent and the soap provided to inmates to clean the floors is sufficient for that purpose. Though inmate Mr Tsheole complained that the soap (called Pearls) provided to inmates to wash caused immonia (sic), maybe he meant pneumonia). This allegation has to be confirmed with laboratory tests of the soap.

As to the cell conditions, the Inspecting Judge inspected other cells first and that of Mr Tsheole. It can be reported that in the Inspecting Judge's view the cells are clean and do not show signs of hygiene neglect. The white soap provided to them to bath is decent, and the green for cleaning, are in the Inspecting Judge's view generous and befitting.

Reclassifications and transfers

The issue about reclassification and transfers were explained to the Inspecting Judge by the Director of the Centre and the Controllers. An inmate qualifies for reclassification and transfer after meeting the requirements in the reclassification tool. If the inmate reaches a certain score, he may be considered for reclassification and transfer. Then, a process of transferring an inmate to another centre commences by contacting the relevant centre for the transfer to be effected.

The transfer centre for Mangaung is the nearby Grootvlei Correctional Centre. The transfer between the two centres is done on an exchange basis. If an inmate qualifies for transfer from Mangaung, Grootvlei must have space for the inmates to be transferred and then Grootvlei will also transfer the exact same number of inmates to Mangaung. At this stage, Grootvlei does not have space for the inmates to be transferred from Mangaung. The other issue that compounds the transfer of inmates after their successful reclassification, is the refusal by the centre of the inmate's choice for transfer.

Reclassification of inmate Mr Tsheole has been refused because of his current score on the reclassification tool. Mr Tsheole was sentenced in October 2010 as a maximum offender. He has applied and was considered for reclassification in 2012, 2014, 2016, and 2017. His transfer application request was that he would like to be closer to his family. Mr Tsheole is a maximum offender and according to the reclassification tool, he will be reconsidered for reclassification in October 2018.

Assistance by the South African Police Services (SAPS)

The Director of the Centre reported that they are not receiving full support (delays) from the SAPS when inmates would like to open cases. The SAPS complain about lack of vehicles to come to the centre to take statements from the inmates. The Director of the Centre indicated that the centre has offered to transport the officers to the centre to take the statements and transport them back

to their stations, but SAPS has not made use of the offered assistance. Currently there is a backlog of cases to be opened for incidents that happened in 2017.

Participation in rehabilitation programmers by segregated inmates

Section 30(1) (a) of the Correctional Services Act 111 of 2008 provides that an inmate may be segregated for a period of time (which may be for part of/ or the whole day and which may include detention in a single cell), other than normal accommodation in a single cell upon the written request of an inmate. It was reported that segregated inmates complain of being deprived of the right to participate in rehabilitation programs. Apparently the center requires that these inmates must be re-incorporated into normal housing units to be allowed to participate in the programs.
